

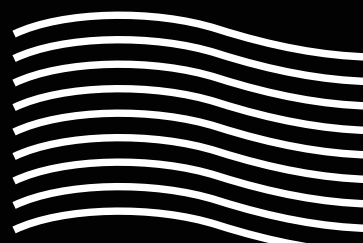

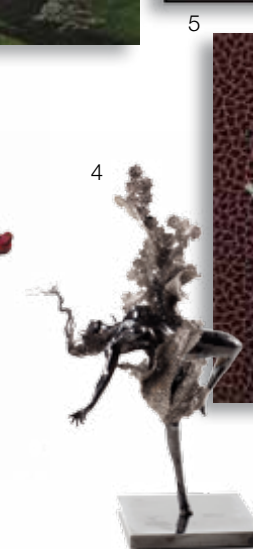
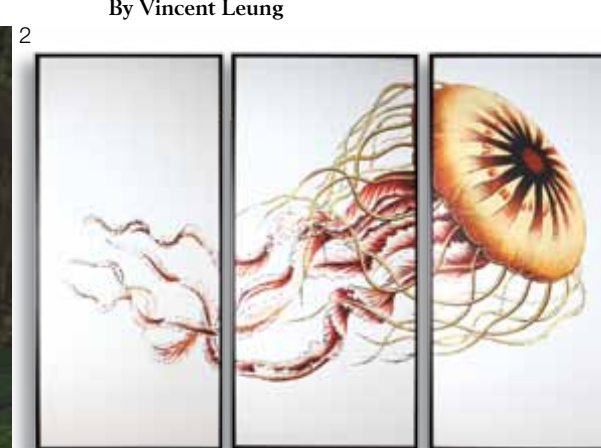

1. **The Waterfall** by Teppei Miyake, 2013
60.5x80.5 cm, mineral pigment paint
on Japanese paper
from Red Elation Gallery
\$30,000

A waterfall brings transcendent energy to this landscape, a nod to the traditional Japanese meditation ritual, *takigyo*, often performed near waterfalls.

2. **Coup D'esprit Jellyfish Triptych S/3**
103x50cm

There's no sting in the tail of this beautiful jellyfish that undulates gracefully across three wall panels. A graceful addition to hang on the wall.

3. **Branches** by Martha Zuik, 2012

The Argentinean artist focuses on vibrant colours and expressive forms in pieces that she has been producing for more than 50 years.

Dela Cruz captures human nature at its most elemental in the fluid, dramatic movements of a flower-bedecked dancer.
